
County Spotlight

2016 Swearing-In Ceremony



Every year, the Passaic County Freeholders hold a re-organization meeting to swear in the new Freeholders, and to vote on a Director and Deputy-Director to take the helm of the Freeholder Board. Freeholder TJ Best was voted for the first time to be Director, making him the first African-American in Passaic County to hold the title. After securing his second term this last election cycle, Freeholder John W. Bartlett was voted in as Deputy-Director. Passaic County also welcomed its newest Freeholder to the board, Cassandra 'Sandi' Lazzara. This position will be Freeholder Lazzara's first experience as an elected official. Freeholder Lazzara credits her father, former Freeholder and State Senator Joseph Lazzara, for teaching her the value of community service.

The swearing-in ceremony took place at the award winning Passaic County Technical Institute, right on the heels of their football team's victory in the Championships. The PCTI Culinary Program also treated everyone to a terrific buffet. The Culinary program is entering a state competition at the end of the month, which it has won 6 out of 7 times. PCTI received some well deserved recognition throughout the evening, which made it the perfect place to host the ceremony. Director Best laid out his vision for the future of the county, which includes continued support for PCTI, Preakness Healthcare Center, social programs that people depend on, and public parks, just to name a few. If there's one take away from this ceremony, it's that 2016 will be an exciting year for Passaic County.



Michael La Place - Planning

Q: What is your department & title?

A: Michael La Place, I am the Director of Planning and Economic Development.

Q: What does your department, and your staff do on a daily basis?

A: The Planning & Economic Development Department is involved with land use planning, development review, urban design and transportation initiatives throughout the 16 municipalities of Passaic County. The department includes the divisions of Planning, Economic Development, Housing and County Historian. Administrative and technical support is provided to the Board of Chosen Freeholders, the County Administrator, Planning Board and committees for Agriculture, Open Space, History & Tourism, Brownfields Redevelopment and the Community Development Block Grant program.

Q: How does your Department help the residents of Passaic County?

A: Comprehensive and cutting-edge land-use and transportation planning is critical to Passaic County and its residents in order to make our county and its 16 communities economically vibrant and competitive, as well as safe, healthy and attractive to visitors and prospective businesses and other commercial interests. The Planning Department also works to preserves Passaic County's rich heritage and market our history and culture to increase tourism activity and investments.

Q: Who can benefit from the work of your Department?

A: Everyone who lives, works and passes through Passaic County benefits directly from the activities of the Planning Department. We prepare plans and bring in grant funding which pays for improvements to the park system, creates new open space, preserves farmland, repairs and enhances roads and transit and subsidizes housing and commercial development in our business districts.

Q: What other organizations do you work with?

A: We work closely with local, regional, state and federal government and agencies, concerned civic groups, local colleges and universities, business groups and private citizens.

Q: What is one accomplishment you wish to highlight?

A: I don't think I can pick just one, I have been so dedicated to these projects asking to pick

my favorite one is like asking me to pick my favorite child. Updating of the County Master Plan, with award-winning elements such as Parks, Recreation and Open Space. Also, the successful effort to bring millions of dollars of grants to Passaic County for civic improvements, the development, design and completion of the new Court House Plaza in Paterson, the on-going restoration and enhancement of the Passaic County Park System, as well as "Complete Streets," which helps us work closely with Engineering to make our street safer for all users.


